


## **ABOUT THE EDITOR**



Indigenous identity, blending lived experience with ancestral wisdom. Chief Laforme has shared his work across Canada and internationally, including leading a historic delegation to the UK in 2023, where he became the first Anishinaabe Chief to meet the British Monarch in over 160 years. He is an Honourary Senior Fellow at Massey College, recognized for his lifelong contributions to Indigenous culture. Chief Laforme resides at the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation in Southern Ontario.




## ABOUT THE AUTHOR






