



Foreword: Audrey Poitras, President of the Métis Nation of Alberta

This book, and accompanying Vimeo documentary link, is a collection of stories about culture, history, and nationhood as told by Métis women. The Métis are known by many names — *Otipemisiwak*, "the people who own ourselves;" *Bois Brules*, "Burnt Wood;" *Apeetogosan*, "half brother" by the Cree; "half-breed," historically; and are also known as "rebels" and "traitors to Canada." They are also known as the "Forgotten People." Few really know their story. Many people may also think that Métis simply means "mixed," but it does not. They are a people with a unique and proud history and Nation. In this era of reconciliation, *Stories of Métis Women* explains the story of the Métis Nation from the women's own perspective. The UN has declared this "The Decade of Indigenous Languages" and *Stories of Métis Women* is one of the few books available in English and *Michif*, which is an endangered language.

Bailey Oster, Editor

Bailey Oster is a Métis woman with roots in the Red River Settlement and St. Paul des Métis. Bailey received her Bachelor of Arts in Sociology with a research focus in restorative justice. She currently works as a manager within the Youth Programs and Services Department at the Métis Nation of Alberta. She was elected as the youngest ever Vice President of New Dawn, the Métis Women's Organization within Alberta at 19 years old and still currently holds the position.




Marilyn Lizee, Editor



No Harm Done contains the text of three short plays, each an exploration of some aspect of a disease. They are: Closer & Closer Apart, Alzheimer's Disease; Fade to Light, Stargardt, a form of macular blindness; and The Last Dance, Parkinson Disease. The first section of the book contains the plays themselves and Stickland's introductions to them, supplemented by commentaries by experts in the medical field. The second section is a guide to playwriting based on teachings the author has been engaged in for decades. This section also includes a how-to approach to writing a play for a specific cause or event. The book will be of interest not only to theatre practitioners and students of playwriting, but to students and professionals (doctors, caregivers, therapists, etc.) in the medical field as well.

ABOUT EUGENE STICKLAND



Born in Regina, Sask., Eugene completed an MFA in Theatre at York University, specifically in playwriting and dramaturgy. He moved to Calgary in 1994 at the time of his first major production at Alberta Theatre Projects of the hit play *Some Assembly Required*, which went on to have over 100 productions worldwide. He wrote nine more

plays following that during a ten year residency at ATP. Following his time at ATP, Eugene wrote a popular weekly column for *The Calgary Herald* and in 2015 he published his first novel, *The Piano Teacher*, which received the W.O. Mitchell Award. He lives alone in the Beltline neighborhood in Calgary.


ABOUT RICH THEROUX



ÎETHKA is the first language instruction book within the Durvile Spirit of Nature series. It features the Îethka (Stoney) First Nation language in context and in action. The book contains a collection of stories by Îethka authors, with each story culminating in a learning section. To assist in nuances of the language, the book also includes an orthography, a glossary, and audio components as web links. A beautifully produced audiobook, with authors' voices and bonus features will also be available at audible.ca, through libraries, and other vendors. The Îethka Nakoda People are an integral part of the Treaty 7 group of Indigenous Nations in Southern Alberta and their spoken language is part of the Dakota linguistic group.

Like its predecessors in the series, *After the Force* features true cases and investigations, this time by Canadian police officers who have served in municipal, provincial, and federal police services. Stories in this anthology are by people who have been passionate about their work in law enforcement and who generously explain what it was about their work that led them to choose a career or specific way of life "after the force."

Among the stunning themes in the book are stories dealing with prostitution and sex work, racism and misogeny, an encounter with a cop killer, police suicides, a child miraculously surviving a fall from a highrise balcony, an officer dealing with a partner who was experiencing severe PTSD, a suicide from a bridge, and child sexual assaults. Optimistic themes and activities arise in these writers' lives after retiring from police work, such as writing, painting, assisting Indigenous communities, and facilitating community improvement.

Detective Debbie J. Doyle is a retired veteran of the Edmonton Police Service. During her career, she was seconded to the United Nations Peacekeeping force in Timor-Leste (East Timor) and worked in the Vulnerable Person's Unit. After serving two tours of duty, she returned to Edmonton, was promoted, and worked in the Child Protection Section and the Internet Child Pornography Unit. Besides compiling and editing, *After the Force*, she also writes fiction.



We Remember the Coming of the White Man chronicles the history of the Sahtú (Mountain Dene) and Gwinch'in People in the extraordinary time of the early 20th century. This 2021 Special Edition of the book recognizes the anniversary of the signing

of Treaty 11, which is greatly controversial due to the emotional and economic fallout for the People. The remastered film *We Remember* (1975) film is included with the book, on DVD and as digital Vimeo links.

As well as poignant essays on Treaty 11, the book includes transcripts of oral histories by Elders. They talk about the early days of fur trading and guns; the flu pandemic; and dismay about the way oil and uranium discoveries and pipelines were handled on their land. A new section of stories is included as well — stories by Leanne Goose, Antoine Mountain, Raymond Yakeleya, and George Blondin.
